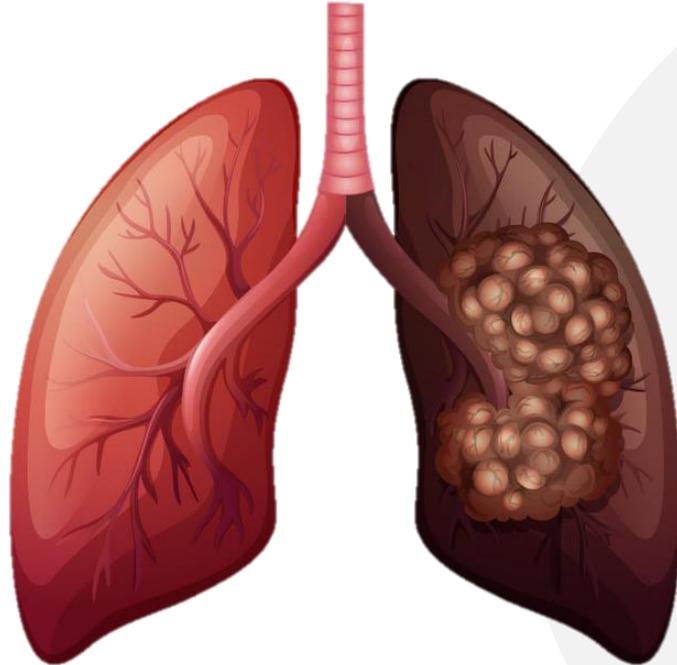

What is Lung Cancer?



- The lungs are a pair of spongy, air-filled organs located on both sides of the chest.
- Lung Cancer is cancer that forms in the cells lining air passages.
- Some cells become abnormal and grow in an uncontrolled way and forms a tumor.
- The tumor interfere with the functions of the lung. It might Also spread to other organs.

Lung Cancer Facts and Statistics - Worldwide



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Tobacco is the major cancer risk factor worldwide and 1.76 million people died from lung cancer in 2018!

According to WHO, **SMOKING** is the most important risk factor for cancer and is responsible for approximately 22% of cancer deaths

In women, incidence rates are generally lower. It is the 3rd most frequent cancer of women (725,352 cases, 8.4% of all cancers) and the second most common cause of death from cancer (576,060 deaths, 13.8% of the total).



Lung Cancer Facts and Statistics- Abu Dhabi 2016

- Lung cancer the leading cause of death among Nationals.
- Most cases are diagnosed a late stage (Stage 4).



Tobacco use and Lung Cancer



- Smoking is the leading cause of lung cancer.
- Smoking causes nearly 9 out of 10 lung cancers cases
- Lung cancer risk factors are related to:
 - Age of smoking onset
 - Amount smoked
 - Gender
 - Product smoked
 - Depth of inhalation
 - Passive smoking, (or the inhalation of tobacco smoke from other smokers) increases the risk of lung cancer by 20-30%.

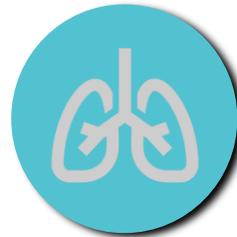

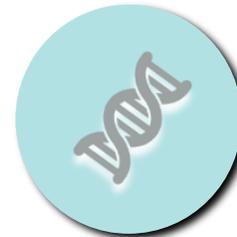

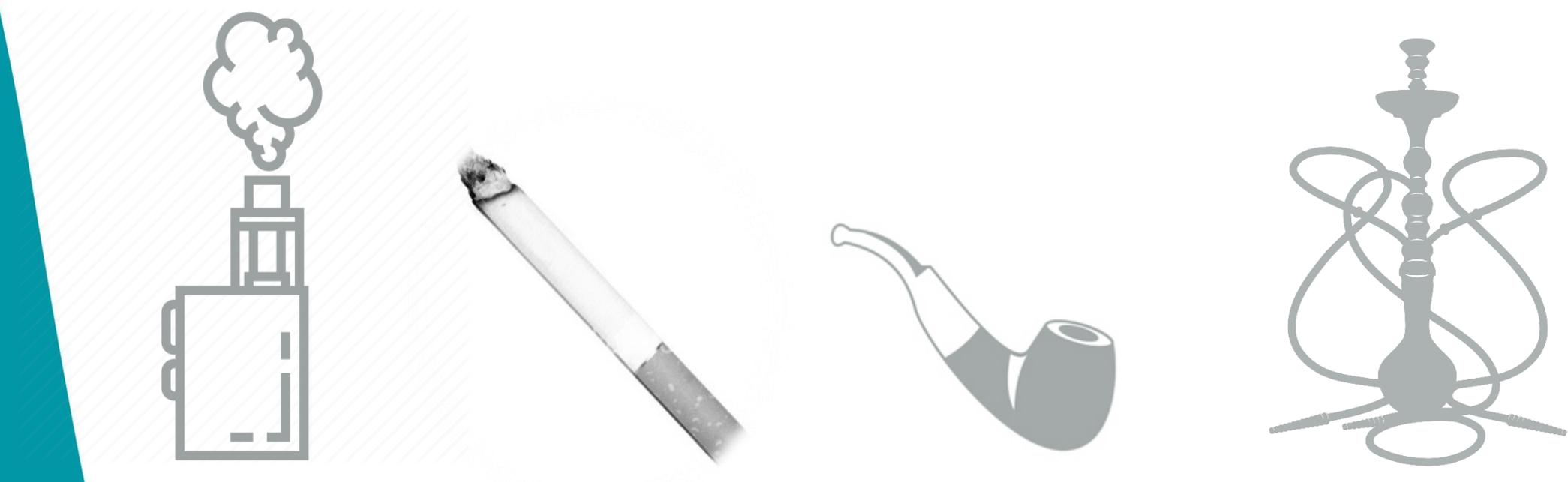

Lung Cancer Prevention



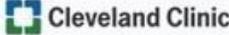
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- If you don't use tobacco, don't start.
- If you use tobacco, try to quit. The risk of lung cancer decreases from 30% to 50% after 10 years of quitting tobacco.
- Stay away from other people who are using tobacco. Breathing smoke can cause lung cancer too.
- Lower exposure to workplace risk factors.
- Lower exposure to radon gas.
- Follow a healthy diet.
- Increase physical activity and exercise.

Health Benefits when Quitting Smoking







What Happens
— WHEN YOU —
QUIT SMOKING?

After

-  **20** minutes
Your heart rate and blood pressure decrease.
-  **12** hours
Your carbon monoxide levels return to that of a non-smoker.
-  **14** days
Your circulation and lung function improve.
-  **1** year
Your risk of a heart attack is half that of someone who smokes.
-  **5** years
Your stroke risk is half that of a smoker's risk.

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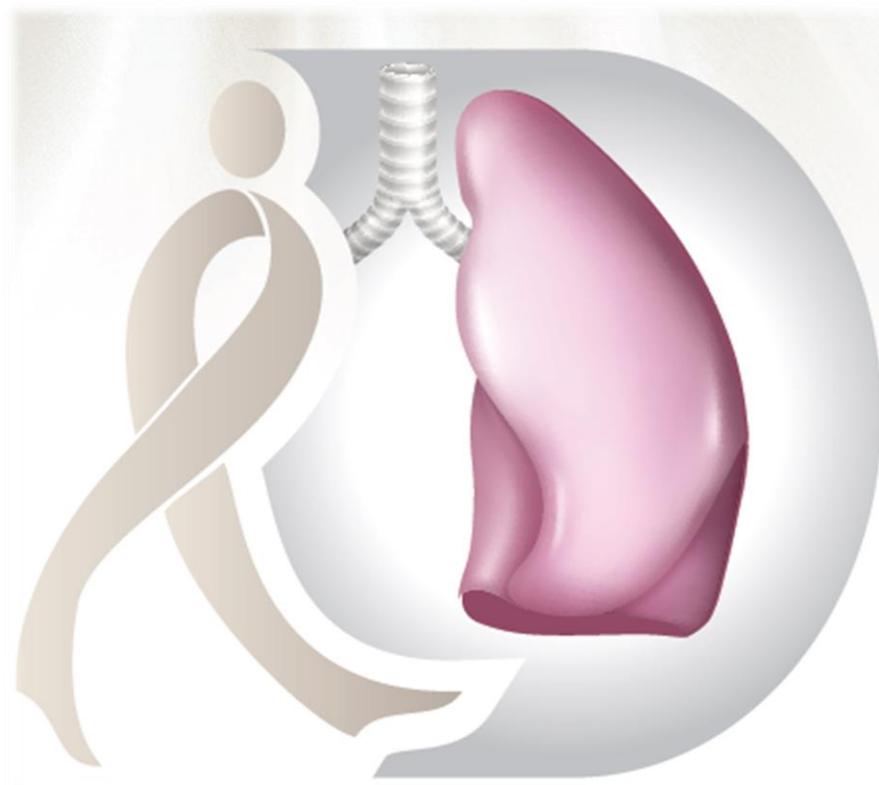
